Lines from Liz

Happy spring! While most of you are entering autumn right now, those of us in the southern hemisphere are starting to enjoy warmer temperatures and budding leaves. Here in Argentina we've had some very welcome rain, although not enough to get us completely out of this period of drought that started early last year.

I'm writing to you from Baradero, a city 100 miles from Buenos Aires that I come to nearly every other week. While here I stay with Silvia and Horacio Orlando, missionaries who moved here full-time last year to pastor the La Roca church and start a Community Health

Evangelism (CHE) program. The Orlando's work with Nora Rodríguez (from Buenos Aires) and a local couple to bring good news to three poor neighborhoods: Tobares, Don Pedro, and Las Malvinas. I come to spend a couple of days meeting with our team and walking through the target neighborhoods. This week we will work on their 2010 budget and support-raising. We are also planning a health screening for the neighborhood children in November.

In the "entering the community" phase of CHE, which is where we are at in Baradero, we spend time in the neighborhoods getting to know the people, forming friendships, and learning what skills the community members have and what they would like to learn. Two discipleship groups (a men's group and a women's group) are planning to start in the target neighborhoods next week. In nearby

neighborhoods La Roca Church has already started several discipleship groups, and five people were baptized last week!

The next phase will be the formation of a committee, composed of locally-recognized leaders who want to work for change. The Orlando's and their team will train this committee extensively, explaining project cycles and the importance of a holistic approach, including a spiritual aspect. The committee will learn to work together as a team, choosing large community projects to work on and selecting "Community Health Evangelists" to go house to house teaching their neighbors. We pray that many will choose personal transformation through a relationship with Christ, as God's message of *shalom* will be clearly presented: harmony with God, our neighbors, ourselves, and creation.

Praises:

- My mother will be coming in October for two weeks! She is such a support to me in this ministry, among other things handling all of my mail back in the United States.
- I have no more debt! Project MedSend took over my medical school debt payments two years ago and recently paid the last installment. Wow!

Prayer Requests:

- Vision Seminars in Misiones Province (the tropical northeast) October 15 and 16: Nora Rodríguez and I will be doing half-day trainings with participants from several villages in hopes that they will lead to the development of CHE programs.
- For the formation of a committee in Baradero (see above) this November.
